Join DC LERA President Patrick McHugh and incoming DC LERA President Steve Sleigh for a conversation with Wilma Liebman, former National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) chair and incoming National LERA President. We will hear from Wilma about her extraordinary career in labor law, including eventful years at the NLRB, as well as discussing future challenges facing the NLRB. She will also address her aspirations as National LERA President.



President Obama named Wilma Liebman Chairman of the National Labor Relations Board in January 2009. She served as its Chairman until August 27, 2011. Since then, she has been engaged in various advisory roles and consulting projects and has taught at several universities, most recently New York University Law School. She is also member of the Board of Directors of the Economic Policy Institute as well as a senior fellow of the Institute for the Study of Employee Ownership and Profit Sharing at Rutgers' School of Management and Labor Relations.

Earlier in her career she served as Deputy Director of the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service (FMCS). Prior to joining FMCS in January 1994, she held positions as Labor Counsel for the International Union of Bricklayers and Allied Craftsmen as well as Legal Counsel to the International Brotherhood of Teamsters.

Wilma is the author of several publications on a variety of labor law and policy issues. She holds an A.B. degree from Barnard College, and a J.D. from George Washington University Law School.
