100 Years of Global Social Policy: Past Success and Current Issues

Daniel Maul

*Associate Professor of Contemporary International
and Transnational History
Department of Archeology, Conservation and History
University of Oslo, Norway*



Prof. Maul will focus on the ILO's role over the past century as a key player in, and as a global forum for, debates on social and labor issues. His talk will highlight the ways in which the ILO has helped structure these debates through its standards-setting, technical cooperation and a myriad of other activities. The results have been continuing practical contributions of the ILO to the world of work and global social policy. He will conclude with a look at present debates on the future of work and the ILO's role in the social dimension of globalization.

Daniel Maul's major research interests are the history of humanitarian aid and international organizations in the 20th century. His many publications on the ILO include: *Human Rights, Development and Decolonization – The International Labour Organization 1940-1970* (2012) and *The International Labour Organization: 100 years of Global Social Policy* (2019). Prof. Maul holds both an M.A. and a Ph.D. from Ludwig-Maximilians-University, Munich, Germany.
